# It's that time of year...

- May is a good time of year to revisit curriculum goals as a staff.
- Go back to your goals from the beginning of the year.
- Plan a staff meeting specifically to review this year's curriculum and plan ahead for next year.

  The goal of the meeting is 3 fold:
- 1. Offer time for teachers to reflect while it is fresh in their minds what worked and what didn't with their curriculum this year.
- 2. Collaborate with teachers as to where they will finish the year and what needs to be addressed at the beginning of next year.
- 3. Plan out and integrate curriculum across the disciplines.
- Remind staff about the *why* behind your curriculum updates.

# Comparison of the two philosophies

## Contemporary Education

- Ordered to material, temporal ends
- Fragmented, industrialized
- Focus on practical skills
- Emphasis on information
- One mile wide, one inch deep
- Lectures+testing = passive learning
- Susceptible to indoctrination

#### Catholic Liberal Education

- Ordered to eternal happiness
- Integration of subjects, knowledge, faith
- Restores meaning and purpose
- Formation; awakens wonder
- Cultivates habits of deep thinking
- Constant discussion = active learning
- Develops intellectual freedom

# Curriculum Mapping

- Start with the overall goals for the year-what disciplines/content did you focus on?
- What went well? Where were the struggles?
- What needs to be added/ removed going into next year?
- Where did integration happen naturally? How can we integrate more going into next year?
- Remember the "Golden Threads" that weave through each discipline.



# Curriculum Integration

- When we integrate we are restoring the fragments and offering education as a *whole, not parts*.
- Weaving together the threads of the various disciplines
- Big Bucket items to integrate:
  - Latin
  - Writing
  - History
  - Theology
  - Art
  - Music
- Art and Music are not after thoughts-- they are pivotal to the renewal and a direct access to BEAUTY



- Select summer readings for your staff that will ground them in the renewal and what the next step is.





## Format for in-service week


- ~DO focus on the importance of your mission and the critical role the teacher plays in the mission.
- ~Do NOT try to cram a lot in, give time for reflection, prayer, classroom set-up, practical questions.
- ~DO begin each day with daily Mass.
- ~Do NOT go later than 3pm.
- ~Do offer time for friendship. (Welcome dinner, happy hours, etc.)


- ~Begin the week with BIG PICTURE- talk about your mission statement, theme of the year, importance of prayer life. (Include guest speakers or workshops if time allows)
- ~On these days plan for intellectual formation in some way, leave plenty of time for discussion.
- ~Move into the practical mid- week. (Handbook, scheduling, policies)
- ~Reserve Friday afternoon to return to the big picture. End the in-service with the calling/ vocation of the teacher and your school's mission.






